ITEMS PERTAINING TO AVIATION SAFETY & AERODROME SECURITY

- 1) The Airport Manager issued, updated and cancelled as required, a number of Runway Surface Condition Reports, through NavCanada.
- 2) A herd of 33 white tailed deer had gathered on the airport property, to the Northwest of Runway 04/22. The Airport Manager monitored their daily activities and fired pyrotechnics, on occasion, to assist in dispersing them away from the runway. By month's end, only 7 10 deer remained on the property. Deer will always pose a serious threat to an aircraft accelerating for takeoff or, upon rollout, after landing.

ITEMS PERTAINING TO MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT

- 1) Feb. 14th, the Airport Manager carried out a scheduled, monthly inspection of the NonDirectional Beacon facility. All of the required tests were performed with no faults being found.
- 2) A courtesy letter was received from Mr. Isao Yamanaka, of Chiba-Ken, Japan. Mr. Yamanaka reported that, on January 7th, 2012, he had monitored the signal being transmitted from the Brockville NDB, through a remotely controlled receiver located in Northwestern Connecticut, USA. Of interest, the receiver was controlled from his location in Japan, via the internet. Mr. Yamanaka reported the following details:

Signal Strength: Fair
Interference: None
Noise: Slight
Fading: Slight
Overall Merit: Fair

It should be noted that the Brockville NDB is rated as Low Power (less than 50 watts strength). Its' sole purpose is for the execution of an instrument approach procedure designed to be completed within fifteen miles of the Brockville airport. Even under ideal, atmospheric conditions, it is uncommon to receive such a strong signal as that received by Mr. Yamanaka.

Dean Glover mailed Mr. Yamanaka a thank you note and wished him continued enjoyment of his hobby.

GENERAL REMARKS

1) Feb. 28th, the Airport Manager received an e-mail message from Mr. Greg Harrington, of Ornge, seeking additional clarification on what air ambulance movements were being requested. The APM responded that monthly data, from Jan 1st 2011 onwards, would be appreciated. No further correspondence has been received from Mr. Harrington.

- 3. In 2004, the airport runway was closed for construction of the extension from September 27, 2004 to November 05, 2004 (6 weeks).
- 4. In 2005, the airport runway was closed for consturction of the extension from May 16, 2005 to June 03, 2005 (3 weeks).
- 5. Air traffic movements are only recorded daily between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
