#### **ITEMS PERTAINING TO AERODROME MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT**

- June 7, the Airport Manager extended the previously issued NOTAM advising that
  the altimeter setting equipment was out of service. Aeroneuf Instruments of
  Montreal had indicated their interest in providing a Site Certification; however, the
  Company has not responded to repeated requests to provide that service.
- June 21, the Airport Manager conducted a scheduled inspection at the NonDirectional Beacon facility. Function tests indicated that all of the transmitter's systems were operating normally. The grass was mowed and brush cut and removed from within the security fencing.
- 3. An area farmer has opened up the first field adjacent to the North side of Runway 04/22. All of the fields were sown with either soya beans or hay.
- 4. June 28, an airport neighbour, Mr. Roger White, opened beaver dams that had been blocking the culvert that passes under the Airport Road (SW of the airport entrance).

#### ITEMS PERTAINING TO AERODROME MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT

- 1. June 7, the Airport Manager issued a NOTAM advising that both rotating beacon lamps were out of service. New, replacement lamps were placed on order.
- 2. July 16, the Passenger Terminal septic system was pumped. The lid on the tank was found to be cracked. Quotations to replace the lid were received and forwarded to the City for consideration.
- 3. July 18, the Airport Manager conducted a scheduled inspection at the NonDirectional Beacon facility. Function tests indicated that all of the transmitter's systems were operating normally.

#### Re: Aircraft Maintenance in City Hangar & Insurance Policies

Please accept this correspondence regarding your city airport hangar lease agreement with the City of Brockville.

#### Aircraft Maintenance in City Hangar

Some individuals in the hangar are doing aircraft maintenance which violates the terms of the lease agreement. This correspondence is being sent to all lessees to remind everyone of the terms of their lease agreement.

Under Terms and Conditions in Section 7. Work Prohibited within the Brockville Thousand Islands Regional Tackaberry Airport it states "no work of any nature, by any person, is permitted upon aircraft with in the Commission operated hangars. Aircraft must be placed outside if work is to be undertaken."

Under Rules and Regulations Item 5 states "No servicing, maintaining, or working on aircraft is to be carried out in the hangar premises without the consent of the commission or its agent except for minor aircraft servicing such as cleaning windows or changing bulbs."

Under Rules and Regulations Item 6 states "No person, without the written consent of the airport manager is to carry out in, on or near the hangar premises, any hazardous operation such as painting, doping, fueling or welding."

Based on the lease agreement, the only type of minor maintenance permitted to aircraft inside the hangar is placing air in the tires, changing light bulbs, cleaning windshield and adding engine oil. No other work is permitted at any time, including after hours. Failure to comply will violate the terms of your lease agreement and it will be immediately canceled resulting in the removal of your aircraft out of the hangar.

#### Insurance Policies

Under Terms and Conditions in Section 8 it states "the owner acknowledges that the Commission is not obligated to maintain any hangar keeper's or bailee's liability insurance in respect to the said airport premises or the said aircraft or any other aircraft or property houses or stores upon the said airport premises. The owner shall be solely responsible for the provision of adequate liability insurance for indemnification for loss, damage, death, or injury which is the responsibility of the said aircraft owner."

To ensure that valid liability insurance policies are in place, please provide a certificate of insurance to Kent Wharton, Airport Manager by July 12, 2013.

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BROCKVILLE

#### **By-Law Number 066-2009**

BY-LAW TO ESTABLISH AN AIRPORT COMMISSION OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BROCKVILLE AND RESCIND BY-LAW 281-89.

WHEREAS Section 70 of the Municipal Act, 2001, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to establish an Airport Commission to operate an Airport on its behalf;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that such a Commission be established and known as the Brockville Airport Commission for the purpose of organizing, maintaining and operating a field and facilities as an Airport;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BROCKVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS;

#### 1. MEMBERS

#### THE COMMISSION SHALL BE COMPOSED OF:

- a) The Mayor of the City of Brockville in each current year shall be an exofficio member.
- b) One member of Elizabethtown-Kitley shall be appointed annually by Elizabethtown-Kitley.
- c) Six (6) persons, each of whom shall be appointed by Council.
- d) The Director of Operations or his/her delegate is a member of the Commission as Secretary. He/she will not have voting privileges.

#### 2. TERM OF OFFICE

- a) Members shall hold office for a maximum term of four (4) years. Members, at the discretion of Council, may be appointed for a second term.
- b) Appointments shall be made effective each December 1 and all appointments and re-appointments of members to the Commission shall be for a term of four years.
- c) In the case of a resignation of a Commission member or for any other reason a Commission member is not able to serve his/her term of office, the Mayor may appoint a replacement to complete his/her term of office.
