Brockville – 1000 Islands Regional Tackaberry Airport

Location

- Owned by the City of Brockville
- located in Elizabethtown-Kitley Township 11 kilometers north of the city limits
- covers 400 acres
- operated under contract by Brock Air Services
- operated under the direction of the Airport
 Commission in compliance with City of Brockville By Law 122-2006. The commission is comprised of
 The Mayor of the City of Brockville as an ex-officio
 member, six (6) persons, each of whom are
 appointed by Council for a 4 year term and the City
 Engineer or his/her delegate is the Commission
 Secretary who does not have voting.

Facilities & Services

- was originally a private facility and was turned over to the city in 1956
- original paved runway was 3,516 feet by 90 feet
- in 2005 the paved runway was expanded to 4,500 feet by 90 feet and is now capable of handling every size of corporate jet with the exception of one

- 1 grass runway
- Airport terminal with washrooms and a passenger waiting area, a pilot's lounge, computer with internet service and a phone where pilots have access to aviation weather and flight planning
- 1 City owned hanger with an 8 aircraft capacity
- 5 private hangers on City leased land
- 1 Clubhouse for the Brockville Flying Club
- 1 City owned building that is leased commercially
- 1 airport garage building
- aircraft public tie-down area and aircraft parking on a paved apron
- Non Directional Beacon (NDB)Approach for use during inclement weather
- 3 GPS approaches 2 are stand alone and 1 is an overlay of the NDB approach
- Runway edge lighting, approach and strobe lights available by pilot activated radio signal
- the airport is a CANPASS port of entry for Canada Customs
- the airport is an Environment Canada weather station with information available on the internet
- the airport has NAVCANADA weather cameras with life feed to the internet

- Staffed 7 days an week including holidays by an authorized Approach Unicom Radio Operator/fuel attendant who are also available after hours by pager
- Daily snow removal during the winter months
- 2 grades of aviation fuel for jets and piston powered aircraft
- Keytrol self serving fueling system for regular users
- lighted vehicle parking area
- security fencing around the apron

Benefits of the Airport

- generate tax revenue
- enhance economic development and tourism
- used by Air Ambulance for Medivac flights the BGH helipad at the Gord Watts Municipal Centre was closed on September 15, 2010
- search and rescue operations
- military and police training
- flight training
- provide enhanced response times to natural or manmade emergencies
- used for recreational flying

Challenges

- in 1994 the Federal Government eliminated infrastructure funding to all 730 airports in Canada with the exception of 26 National Airports
- airports are public infrastructure just like roads and bridges and as they age and deteriorate no federal or provincial funds are available to offset repairs or replacement costs

Future Goals

- lobby both the Federal and Provincial Governments to renew aviation infrastructure funding.
- expand the commercial leases at the airport
- provide aircraft access to the City of Brockville and surrounding area for future economic development

The current month's aircraft movements of interest:

Helicopters: 1 air ambulance, 1 Enbridge (pipeline patrol), 2 Cdn. Coast Guard and 2 Hydro One Fixed wing: 1 air ambulance and 6 single engine business (American Iron and Metal Inc.)

ITEMS PERTAINING TO AVIATION SAFETY & AERODROME SECURITY

- 1) Jan. 1st, the Airport staff discovered recent damage to the page wire fencing that runs parallel to the Airport Road. Approximately fifteen feet of fencing and two wooden posts were damaged. There was further evidence of a vehicle having continued onto the Airport property. The Airport Manager contacted the O.P.P.; however, no accident report had been filed and the local detachment was unaware of the occurrence. A fencing contractor may be required to replace the posts and mend and stretch new page wire.
- 2) The Airport Manager issued and updated or cancelled as required, a number of Runway Surface Condition Reports, through NavCanada.

ITEMS PERTAINING TO MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT

- 1) Jan. 4th, the Airport Manager carried out a scheduled, monthly inspection of the NonDirectional Beacon facility. All of the required tests were performed with no faults being found.
- 2) Jan. 16th, a plumber from Houle Plumbing and Heating repaired the water pressure tank in the Passenger Terminal utility room. During that same service call, the plumber also repaired a toilet water tank in one of the bathrooms.
- 3) Jan. 18th, due to a buildup of freezing rain, a load of screened, winter sand was applied to Runway 04/22 as well as, the Airport's aprons, taxiways and driveway. The Airport Manager visually inspected the material to ensure that it was of the proper grit size and also, that was free of salt contamination, prior to the load being spread. After its' application, there was a noticeable improvement to the safe handling of both aircraft and vehicles.
